PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hope. At Josiah White's, it is ingrained in our DNA. But what does that look like operationally?

- **Residential Services** (p. 6) provided hope for **195 students** in 2023
- **Compass Rose Academy** (p. 5) offered hope to **43 young women**
- **Recovery Services** (p. 7) presented hope to **109 teens**
- **Growing Teens for Life** gave hope to **126 qualified participants** through vocational opportunities
- **Family Preservation** (p. 9) shared hope with **81 families**
- **Foster Care** (p. 8) offered hope to **223 children in crisis**
- **Spiritual Life** (p. 4) gave hope to countless staff, students, spouses, board members and parents

We meet every individual where they are and offer them persevering hope through Christ. That may look like a moment, an hour, a week, a month, or a year. And in 2023, we met 685 children, teens, and families where they were to provide hope that was first freely given to us.

But there is still work to be done. It has been said that hope is not a strategy. But in our line of work, it is a fundamental element in all we do. It can be found in every conversation that is had, but it is most evident in the *"I could have never imagined..."* statements.

- *"I never imagined I would graduate high school."*
- *"I never imagined I would finish a 5K."*
- *"I never imagined I would get sober."*
- *"I never imagined love like this existed."*
- *"I never imagined I could be a good parent."*
- *"I never imagined I would ever feel part of a family again."*
- *"I never imagined I could love a job so much."*

These are real things that we hear on a daily basis, and it all began with a seed of hope. So if hope is at the heart of our organization, I believe that business is good and will continue to expand.

In Romans 12:12, Paul challenges and encourages us to "be joyful in hope, patient in trials, and faithful in prayer."

My prayer is, and will continue to be, that in 2024 we are given wisdom and discernment to properly cultivate this hope and offer a brighter future for those we serve.

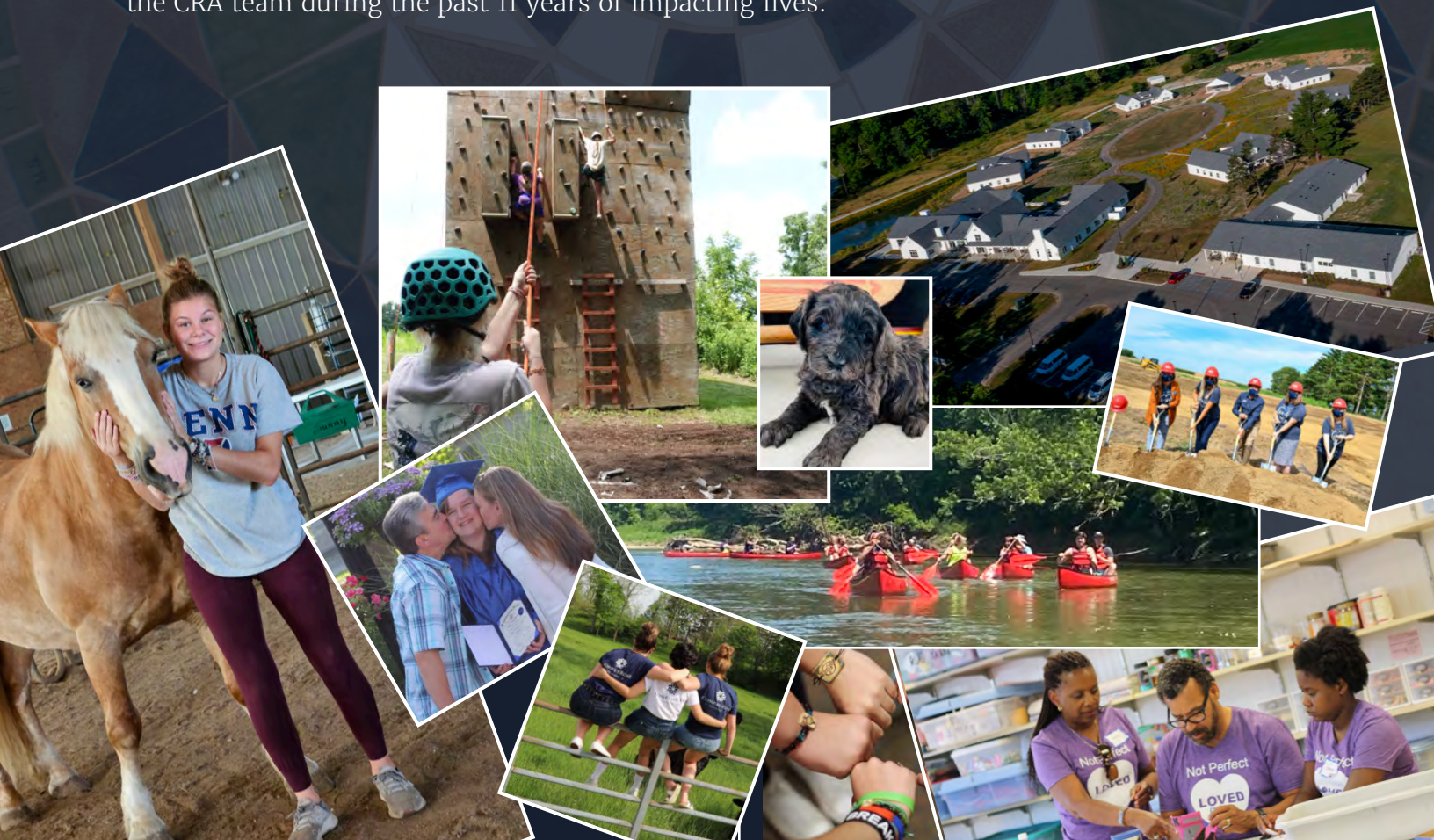
COMPASS ROSE ACADEMY

Over the past 11 years, Compass Rose Academy has served 233 girls and families with much success. CRA is grateful for the remarkable successes achieved and the meaningful impact that has been had in the lives of these girls and their families. - Creating an innovative Project-Based Learning model curriculum for an on-site accredited private Christian high school.
- Building an intentionally-designed and award-winning campus which the program began operating from in August of 2021.

Planting Seeds for Success

Much like any other teen, Josh, a student that recently graduated from Josiah White's residential program, enjoys sports, playing guitar, and drawing, with dreams of becoming a tattoo artist one day.

When he first arrived at Josiah White's, Josh was struggling with anger, but the welcoming atmosphere and caring staff members soon began to make a difference.

“Being around all these wonderful people made me realize that I don't want to be that kid anymore,”

said Josh.

A key component of Josh's time in the program has been his active involvement in Growing Teens for Life (GTFL), Josiah White's vocational development program. This program's goal is to equip teens with essential life skills, preparing them for a successful transition into adulthood.

As part of GTFL, Josh worked at 50 East Garden Center and Cafe, which is open to the public and provides on-campus internship opportunities for students like Josh. Through Josh's work at 50 East, he learned how to interact with the public and build meaningful

relationships with the staff, furthering his personal development. He also earned valuable certifications, allowing him to embrace new possibilities for his future.

Josh's journey at Josiah White's stands as a testament to the transformative power of positive environments and dedicated support systems. From overcoming anger to starting to make his future dreams a reality, Josh's story exemplifies that healthy second chances are possible when individuals are provided with the right tools and encouragement to shape their futures.

RECOVERY SERVICES

NO MATTER WHAT

“God, I don’t know if I believe you’re real, maybe you are, maybe you aren’t...Maybe you love me if you’re real, but give me strength no matter what happens, even if I go to prison.”

That’s the prayer that 17-year-old Gavin* prayed while in jail, facing 15 to 40 years.

When he went to court, he found out that coming to Josiah White’s was a possibility. After the staff at the Youth Opportunity Center in Muncie wrote a character reference for him, the judge decided to give him a chance to get the help he needed.

While in Josiah White’s Recovery Services program, Gavin took advantage of the opportunity and took the program seriously. He came to realize how he was hurting those around him and hurting himself. He looked forward to the daily Narcotics Anonymous meetings, and for Christmas, he received the book, *Just for Today: Daily Meditations for Recovery Addicts*, and began carrying it with him everywhere.

After completing Recovery Services 28-day program, Gavin transitioned into Josiah White’s TREC (Teaching Recovery Empowering Change) program through Residential Services. Staying in treatment longer has allowed Gavin to further develop the skills he started building while in Recovery Services.

Gavin has been encouraged in his recovery by Josiah White’s staff and feels that they truly care about him. One staff member has noticed Gavin’s interest in music and has allowed Gavin to play his personal ukulele.

Gavin is looking forward to graduating from high school while at Josiah White’s and also has the short term goal of getting off of probation. In the future, Gavin hopes to make music and become an addiction counselor and an NA sponsor.

“I don’t want to get famous – I want to make an impact, no matter what I do...I just want to help people know they’re not alone,” said Gavin.

FOSTER CARE

FROM FOSTER FAMILY TO FAMILY FRIENDS

When Josiah White's foster parents Travis and Julie Beam first entered the ministry of foster care, they were hoping it would be an avenue for them to minister to their community. However, they quickly realized it was also an opportunity to make a profound impact on a family's future.

Shortly after becoming licensed, Travis and Julie received their first placement of two siblings, a boy and a girl.

"In the first few weeks, I had this conversation with the Lord about how abruptly mashing families and expectations together isn't a natural thing," said Julie.

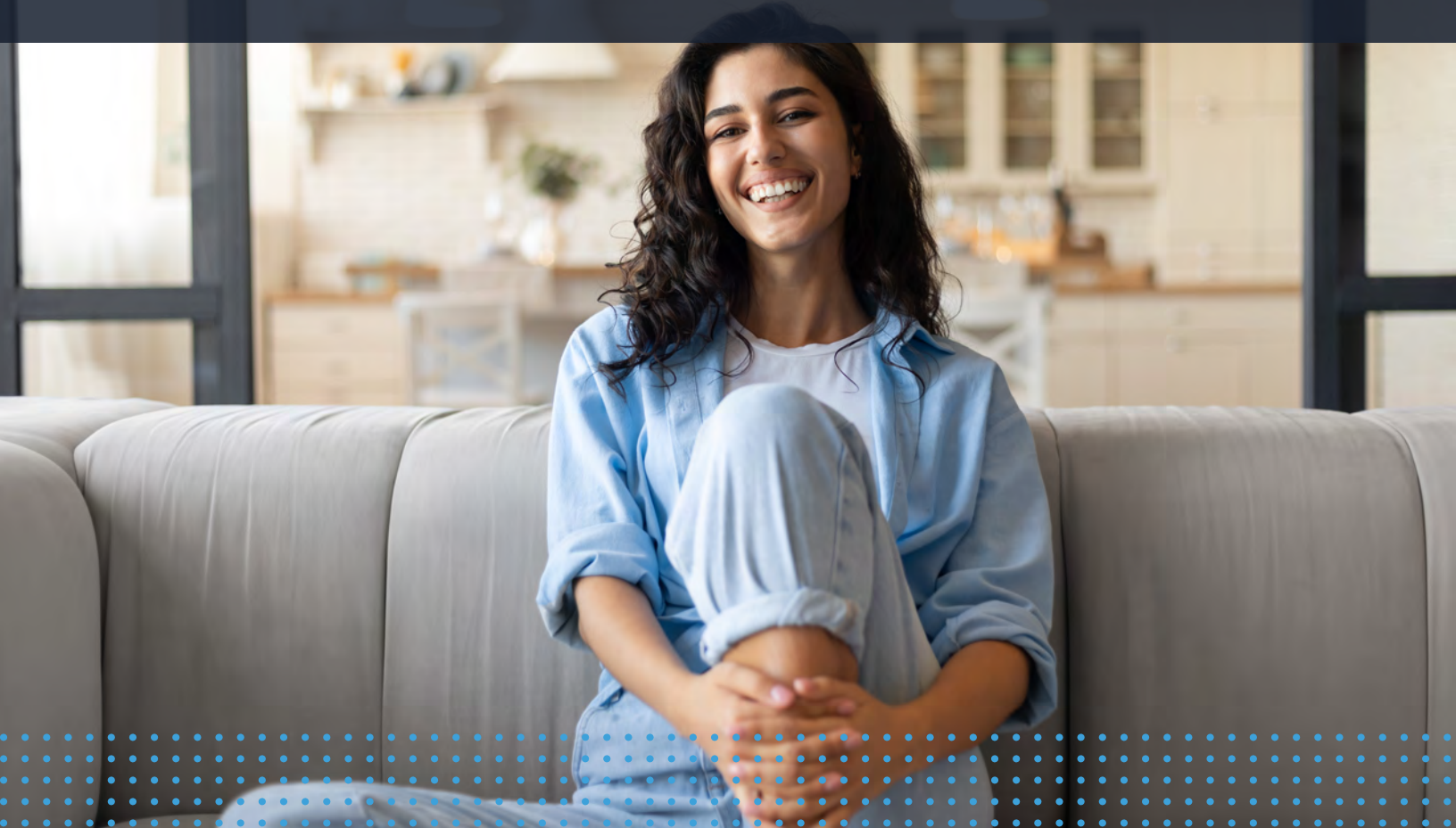
It was then she realized that this wasn't how God intended things to be, but her and Travis's role as foster parents was to join God in bringing restoration to the family He had connected them with.

At one of the first supervised visits, Travis and the children's biological mom had an opportunity to start building a relationship. Travis and Julie began realizing that their foster children's mom viewed them as allies and not as competition in the process of being reunited with her kids.

Throughout the placement, Travis and Julie took the children to church and prayed with them daily at meal times and bedtime. The day after the children were reunited with their mom, she texted the Beams saying the kids really liked going to church with them and asked where they attended. That Sunday, the children and their mother joined the Beams at church for a "Family Sunday" service with a kids' time, making it even more evident that God's hand was in the situation.

Since that weekend, the Beams have continued to support the family by celebrating milestones, inviting the children over to play, and reminding them that they are praying for them. The children's mother is now being supported by one of Josiah White's Family Skills coaches that goes to the Beam's church. We are grateful for the role that the Beams are able to play in God's restoration of this family!

FAMILY PRESERVATION



Self Sufficiency in Six Months

Jasmine*, a mother of five, recently gained independence in more ways than one through Josiah White's Family Preservation Services.

Before being referred to the program, Jasmine was using alcohol daily to cope with her grief over the death of her son at just six months old. Through the help of her therapist, Jasmine confronted the emotions underneath her struggle with alcohol. She took her therapy seriously and used it to set goals and ask

questions. Slowly, Josiah White's staff noticed her smiling more often as she began practicing healthy coping strategies.

Throughout her treatment, it became evident that Jasmine also needed a change in her living environment. She and her Family Skills Coach worked together to find her new housing near her mother, who served as a major part of her support system. This change, coupled with the realization of the severity of her struggle,

prompted Jasmine to gradually reduce her drinking. During this time, Jasmine also maintained employment, which allowed her to become financially independent.

After connecting her with community resources to support her continued growth and healing, Jasmine's case was closed successfully after almost six months. We are so grateful for how God was able to work in Jasmine's life!

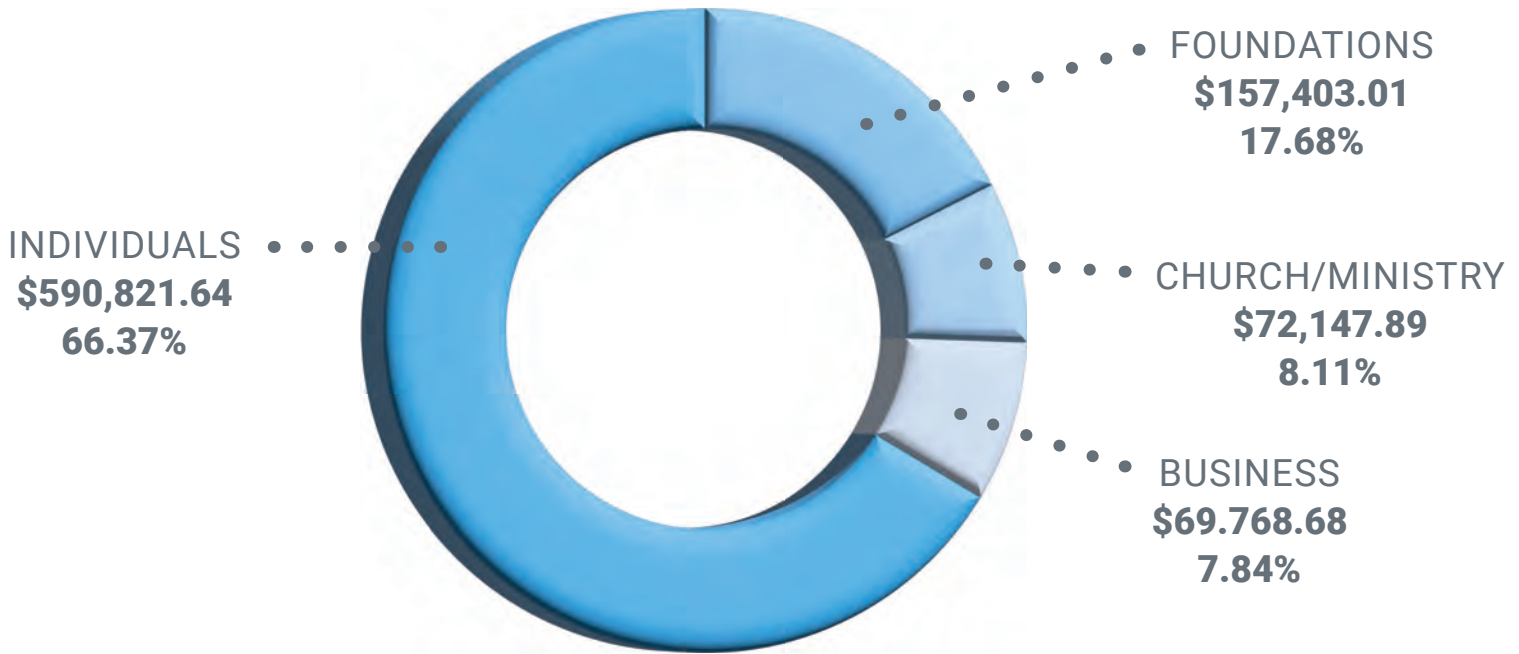

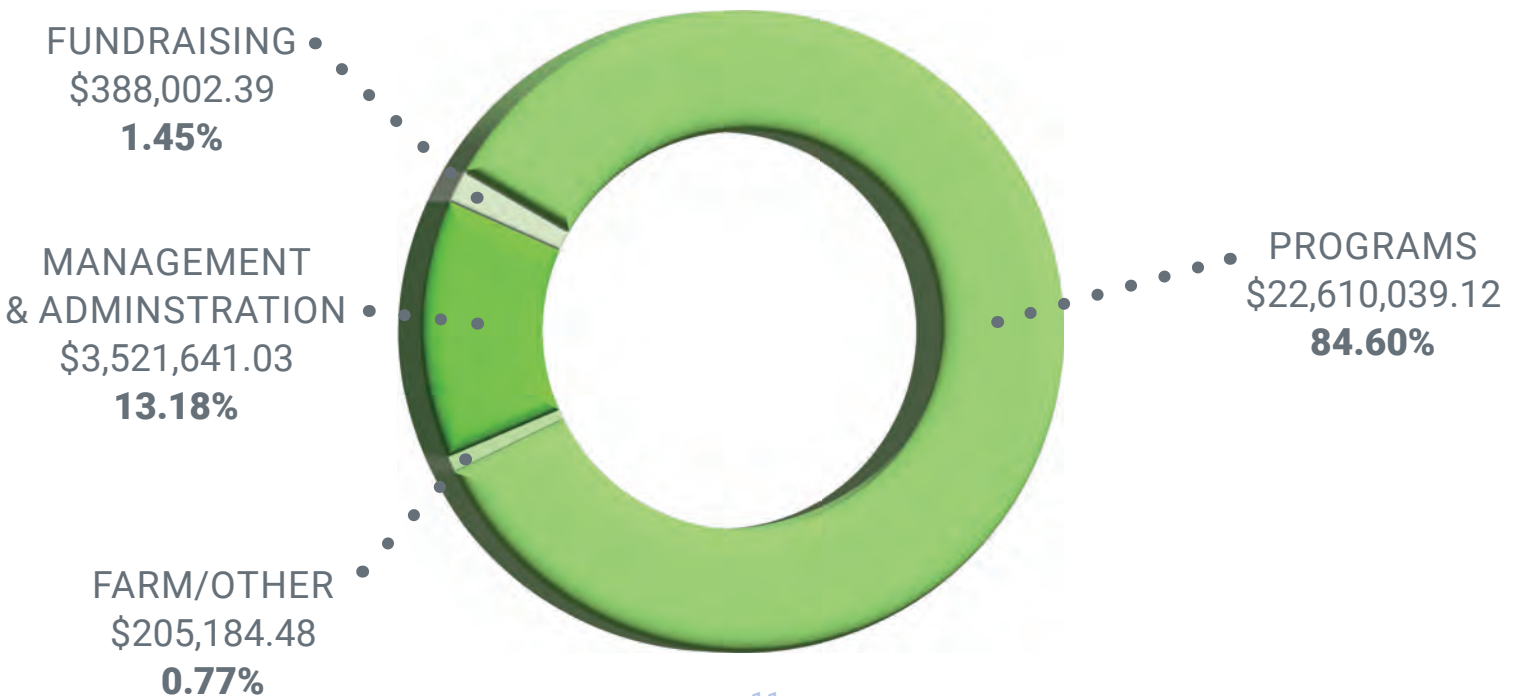
